ABSTRACT SUBMISSION:

An abstract is a short document that is intended to capture the attention of a potential readers. Contributions to ICDS 2022 should only be submitted online.

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION CRITERIA:

- All abstracts must be submitted in English.
- The Font used should be Times Roman. Upper- and Lower-case letters should be used with proper justification of the document.
- Abstracts should be based on the topics listed in the section topics of this website

- The abstract should satisfy the word limit of 250-350 words
- Abstract should have between 4-10 keywords clearly reflecting the content of paper.
- It should be well written in terms of language and grammar
- It must make a clear statement regarding the topic and research in question.

ABSTRACT SAMPLE:

Title of your abstract

Body of the abstract:

The body of your abstract starts here. These opening statements show the knowledge on your topic. All the information consists of introduction, objective, purpose, research, findings and summary. The first part should be the problem you set out to explore. It should not be very comprehensive as a full literature review of course but should help the listener catch up to the subject of discussion and build the investment. The next part should discuss the concerns in the respective department and the limitations in this area of work as well as the clearance that this presentation will address these gaps. The main purpose of your study should be mentioned here in obvious terms. State the methodologies being used and their advantages. Make sure to elaborate the findings or obvious solutions to current problems that you came up with. This will take up most of your abstract space as this is the main intention of your study. It should be written in a manner which is suitable and comprehensible to both your listener and a fellow presenter. In your own words, leave a noticeable note at the end to let your audience know what you think of your works and it's importance.

Keywords:

A few selective keywords to make your abstract stand out among others.
